Penn State University offers an exciting opportunity for high school students to get an early start on their college degree! Through Penn State's Dual Enrollment Program, students can take college courses at a 50% tuition reduction and earn Penn State credits!

Qualified junior and senior students can prepare for the future by earning college credits and experiencing the workload of a college course. Credits earned can be applied to a Penn State degree and will appear on a Penn State University transcript.

Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Take college courses taught by Penn State professors
- Get a Penn State ID card and email access account
- Experience classes in a university environment with other college students
- Receive a 50% grant-in-aid reduction for tuition costs
- Enjoy opportunities to participate in college activities
- Make use of our on-campus Student Success Center, tutoring, advising, library, and computer facilities
- Receive Penn State undergraduate credits after successful completion of a course

How to Apply

New applicants are required to supply the following:

- A Penn State Fayette non-degree Dual Enrollment application
- A signed parental consent form
- A current official high school transcript
- A guidance counselor approval form
- *High school juniors only*– A current standardized test score (SAT, ACT, or PSAT is preferred, but PSSA is also acceptable)
- Other documents may be requested upon application review

After submitting a completed application, you will be notified by phone of the admission decision and given instructions for scheduling courses.

Returning students are required to complete the following:

- Submit a completed and signed parental consent form.
- Contact the Dual Enrollment Coordinator Tricia Homonai at 724-430-4285 or trh20@psu.edu to schedule your class(es).

Returning students who have previously been accepted into the program do not need to resubmit a non-degree application, provided that:

- There has been no break in enrollment.
- The student has performed at a grade of "C" or better in prior Dual Enrollment courses at Penn State.

Terms and Conditions

Please note the following guidelines for Dual Enrollment through Penn State Fayette:

- For consideration, high school *seniors* must have a minimum cumulative grade-point average of **3.0**.
- For consideration, high school *juniors* must have a minimum cumulative grade-point average of **3.0** and provide a standardized test score.
- A guidance counselor approval form is needed.
- Seniors may take up to 8 credits per semester and earn a maximum of 16 credits. Juniors and underclassman must contact the Admissions Office to learn about their credit options.
- Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in each course to remain in the program.
- Credits earned under the provision of Dual Enrollment are valid at any Penn State location and may be transferred to another institution in the same way as other Penn State credits.
- Students who have graduated from high school may not participate in this program.
- Home-schooled students need to contact the Admissions Office to determine eligibility for enrollment.

A special part of the Dual Enrollment program is a grant-in-aid in the amount of 50% of the tuition for a maximum of 8 credits per semester. Additional fees may also apply. Students enrolled in a school that participates in the Dual Enrollment grant may be eligible for additional funding to offset all of the remaining cost.
