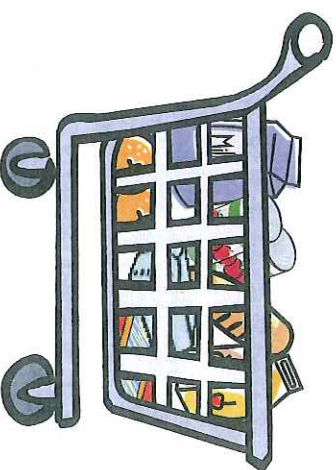

FOOD ASSISTANCE IN FAYETTE COUNTY

SNAP (Food Stamps)

What is it? SNAP (the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program—formerly Food Stamps) is the cornerstone of all federal nutrition assistance programs, providing benefits for the purchase of nutritious food to qualified low-income people in addition to economic benefits for the local community.

What does it provide? Participants receive monthly benefits via an electronic debit card, known as the Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card, that can be used to buy food at any store that accepts food stamps.

Church & Religious Charity Programs

Many churches have funds set aside to help both church and non-church members in need on a case-by-case basis. To find out more, you may want to contact the church where you attend or consult the phone book for a listing of local religious organizations.

Most Catholic churches offer aid to the community through their support of the **St. Vincent de Paul Society**, a charity that offers those in need financial assistance as well as help with food and clothing depending on individual circumstances. Nutrition Education Program

FCCAA offers the Nutrition Education Program to low-income individuals and families who are eligible to receive SNAP benefits. The program aims to foster positive behavioral changes related to nutrition and physical activity.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

What is it? WIC provides nutritious foods for eligible Women, Infants and Children

What does it provide? Participants receive vouchers for nutritious foods including milk, eggs, peanut butter, cheese, dried peas and beans, juice, cereal and infant formula as well as tuna and carrots for nursing mothers. Additional vouchers for fresh produce in the summer and fall are also provided.

Do I qualify? Call your local WIC clinic for income eligibility or for more information

Produce to People

What is it? Produce to People is a large-scale produce distribution program.

What does it provide? Participants receive 30-50 pounds of fresh produce.

Food Pantries

Food pantries are community-based programs that serve people in need with free food and other grocery products to add to their monthly food supply, tiding them over during hard times.

The Fayette County Community Action Food Bank operates over 49 pantries located throughout the county. Participants in the food pantry distribution program must meet income limits based on household size. To find out which pantry serves your area, as well as the dates and times of pantry distribution, please call **724-437-6050, ext. 1264.**

Summer Food Service Program

The Summer Food Service Program (SFS) is designed to fill that nutrition gap and make sure children can get the nutritious meals they need. Senior Boxes (CSFP)

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) provides a free nutritious box of food to qualified senior citizens 60 and older and those families who have been referred to the program by WIC.
